

In an effort to provide an appropriate education for all students, the board has established a program to serve children in the district who are identified as "at risk".

"Children at risk" includes, but is not limited to, potential dropouts, truants, homeless students, children of poverty, school-aged parents, and students who are one or more years behind their age group in the number of credits attained or in the basic skill levels.

All programs developed for children at risk shall be designed to:

- Improve and expand educational opportunities for these children on an individualized basis, through a variety of means (e.g., remedial instruction);
- Provide alternative courses or program modifications, which satisfactorily meet the district graduation requirements;
- Encourage parental involvement; and
- Encourage cooperation with community support services agencies.

Students shall be identified and referred to these programs in accordance with state regulations and guidelines established by the administration.

A parent/guardian who believes that their child may qualify for and benefit from any of the above modifications, should contact the principal, school counselor, or director of special education.
