The Board of Education recognizes that the instructional delivery system continues to change as society adapts to how individuals learn and as educational institutions promote delivery methods consistent with evolving technologies. The board considers online instruction a means to expand course offerings and provide an educational alternative to address the diverse learning needs of students.

High School students may earn credits by completing online courses offered by accredited agencies that are approved by the board. Administrative approval must be obtained before a student enrolls in an online course. Students applying to take an online course will be required to complete necessary prerequisites and take a readiness assessment, which will help determine the student's ability to function effectively in an online learning environment.

Students may complete online coursework anywhere internet access is available, including during the regular school day. When utilizing district resources, students are required to comply with the Internet/Acceptable Use Policy as outlined in the student handbook. Students in violation of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action consistent with district policies.

The district will provide appropriate local learning support to enhance student success, and technical support of district resources, as needed.

Credit recovery: For credit recovery a student/family would be required to pay \$50.

Personal choice: In the case that a student wants to choose a course that is not required the student/family would be required to pay \$50.

Acceleration: In the case that a student wants to take courses to graduate early the student/family would pay \$100.

Career Focused Electives: \$100.00 (non-refundable)

Scheduling conflict: The district will pay for all course fees.

Full-time online: The district will pay for all course fees.

The district must receive an official record of quarterly, semester, and/or final grades in the online course before credit toward graduation will be recognized.

If a student does not complete a course or receives a failing grade for a course, the student/family shall reimburse the district for the full cost of the course.
