All regular and special meetings of the Board of Education shall be open to the public, except when exempted under Wisconsin Statutes 19.85. Because the board desires to hear the viewpoints of citizens throughout the district, it shall offer suitable time at all meetings for citizens to be heard.

Any individual wishing to speak at a meeting shall inform the board president prior to the time provided on the agenda, of the desire to do so via a form provided in the meeting room giving the following information: name; address; group represented, if any; and item or concern individual wishes to speak about.

Comments at a regular meeting may deal with any topic related to the agenda and shall be limited at the president's discretion. Comments at special meetings must be related to the call of the meeting.

Questions requiring investigation shall be referred to the board or administrative staff for consideration and later response.

Members of the public will not be recognized by the president as the board conducts its official business, except when the board schedules in advance an interim public discussion period on a particular agenda item.
